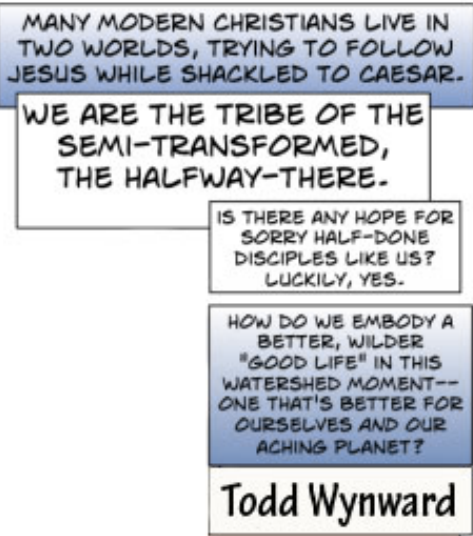


Adult Program

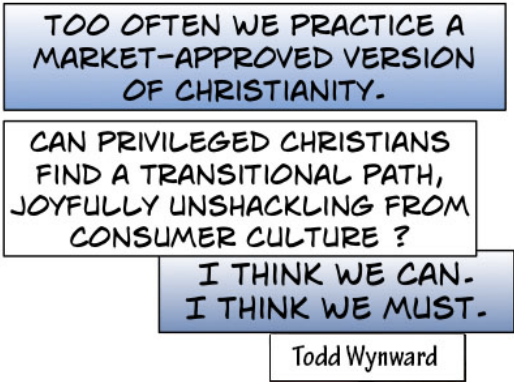
Children under age 3 may attend free of charge.
